Of course, my dear daughter Amy is very involved in helping me and taking me to appointments with the orthopedic doctor. I am so blessed.

I am also so humbled and blessed by how the Lord uses the TUMI of Colorado ministry to reach people with the Gospel of Christ Jesus and especially to grow and equip disciples in serving Christ. The biggest part of our ministry is offering the TUMI Capstone Program, also known as Church-Based Seminary, to those who would probably not be able to afford or take time due to family or job responsibilities. I myself was a blessed receiver of the gift of the TUMI seminary program and have had unimaginable opportunities as a disciple/Chaplain/Pastor to serve Christ Jesus. And now, we are offering a new trauma healing program that is geared for teens. Christian and I spent a week in Dallas taking the Facilitator training, and we are excited to offer this program also. TUMI Capstone Program

The Urban Ministry Institute (TUMI) of Colorado offers the TUMI Capstone Program, a ministry of World Impact. This program is a comprehensive, seminary-like, discipleship development program (16 modules) with curriculum covering everything needed to prepare God-called disciples for sharing the Gospel of Christ Jesus and effective ministry—whether in a local community on the outside or inside a prison community.

The required, prerequisite Fight the Good Fight course has become very popular on the outside and inside the prisons. On the outside, our students come from many Churches in the Denver Metro area. In the prisons, our TUMI students are always recruiting inmates to take the course. Our students get of a taste of walking closer and more intimately with Jesus, and I get to watch the Holy Spirit guide and direct them into serving Him with their gifts and talent. I am so amazed at the different types of ministry my students have gone into.

NEW! Trauma Healing Program for Teens

In July, Christian and I participated in a week-long Facilitator Certification training for World Impact's

Healing Teens' Wounds of Trauma

course. The Trauma Healing course we offer now is very adult-focused. The Teen Trauma Healing course is unique to what interests teens and includes a special Teen Facilitator workbook using teen-related, scripture-based topics and activities.



As a Certified Counselor, I counsel with teens who are facing challenging trauma and pressure in their young lives, and they are exhibiting negative behaviors that are impacting their family life, friendships, teacher relationships, etc.

The Teen Trauma Healing course was designed for ages 14 through 18. It provides a Bible-based interactive group course for teens addressing questions that they (Continued on page 3 – upper-right column)

The Onesimus Workshop is designed to help churches discuss the hard issues of reentry ministry; understand a Biblical view of prison ministry and prison culture; and encourage them to welcome and empower Christian returned citizens.

We heard from our formerly incarcerated speakers how difficult it is for released prisoners to succeed outside the prison. We also heard from a spouse how difficult it can be for family members when their loved one returns home after incarceration. Christian and I shared success stories of how our released TUMI students and graduates are serving the Lord on the outside.

The workshop was packed with great information about how imperative it is for Christian ex-offenders to have a place to worship, fellowship, and serve. The church plays a key role in mentoring, encouraging, and incorporating ex-offenders into their congregation.

On the Workshop Evaluation form, one participant commented: "A look into a culture I only knew from TV. ... Thank you Lord for a path back to righteousness." Another participant wrote: "I have learned so much about prison life that I was unaware of before. I think this will help me relate better to those I meet who have served in prison."

Praise the Lord! Much fruit for sharing our TUMI of Colorado Prison Ministry programming came out of this workshop!

We promote a safe place where teens can begin to find healing from some of the hurts they have had in life.

During the training, we took the same course that the teens take with all the art sessions, skits, and activities. It was fun but exhausting!! ☺



Trauma Healing Facilitator Training

We continue to add to our Trauma Healing Facilitator Team. Currently, we have five Advanced Facilitators and two Apprentice Facilitators on our team.

Initial Equipping Trauma Healing Facilitator Training

After taking the Trauma Healing course, two participants—Catherine McHenry and Greg Speer—were impressed with the healing experience they received through the program, and shared that they "want to give back." Catherine and Greg took the Initial Equipping Trauma Healing Facilitator training on Saturday, October 25. They are now Apprentice Facilitators and will help facilitate two
