I love my job! I could not do this without the prayers and financial support of you my partners.

We are in strange times. When thinking about all the changes we've had to make during the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, I think of Proverbs 19:21: "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails." (NIV 2011) That is a fact that no one person or circumstance can change. He is sovereign.

In March, we learned that all prisons were closed to outside programs. We do not have any way to be in contact with our TUMI students at either the men's or women's prisons. We pray that the Lord is using our TUMI students and grads to take the Light—the Gospel of Jesus Christ—into the darkness. They are well-equipped as Christian leaders and can give testimony of their personal journey in knowing Christ. In fact, the Chaplain at the men's prison tells me that two TUMI grads have offered to lead the TUMI class until the prisons open up for volunteers to come in. That's what I'm talking about!

Praise the Lord for the invention of telephones and online meeting applications—Zoom and Meet.Google!! In spite of being restricted to staying alone in my condo for these months, I have been blessed to continue my ministry with

The Urban Ministry Institute (TUMI) and with the church-plant team at Grace of the Lord Fellowship (Grace church) in Aurora (also see https://graceofthelord.church/leaders/).

In January, I started a new TUMI class at Grace church. Our pastor, CJ Counts, welcomes the TUMI program to build up Christian Leadership in the church. We currently have five students. After only one completed module (semester) and into our second module, we are already seeing a good return on investment as our students step up and ask CJ where they can be used in our church. As part of the Grace church leadership team, I also lead the Sunday morning adult Bible study. We are studying the "Experiencing God" Bible study by Henry Blackaby. This is a great study with a churchwide, spiritual growth emphasis. I've led this study many times in the past and selected it with the hope that we would come to understand how to experience God as a church and it would help us to better function as the body of Christ. It's been such a blessing to watch that happen.

Even with the COVID pandemic, we have been able to help empower a released inmate that was a TUMI student at one of our men's prisons. See **Incarceration to Incorporation (I2I)** on page 2.

As I write this newsletter, my precious 93-year-old-mother is in hospice. On June 3, she had a heart attack, and it's been one thing after the other. It was a gift from the Lord. Now we wait on Him to take her home.

#### **TUMI Denver**

#### **TUMI Student Focus**

Being a new TUMI student is "scary" for most of my students. Either they have not been in school for years or their school years were not a good experience and challenging. My job is to walk alongside the students and find a way they can overcome that fear and turn it into discovering how they can be successful. I often find myself saying "We'll find a way to make this happen." I look forward to that light that eventually comes on in their eyes letting me know they are walking close with the Lord and excited to keep on their TUMI Christian leadership journey.

#### Mary and Annissa

**Mary** is a beautiful 80-year-old whom I thought was much younger. She is married to Lee and has four adult children. For over 50 years, **Mary** has been a Christian leader in the church—in children's ministry, women's ministry, and more.

Currently, **Mary** is mostly blind due to macular degeneration and is confined to a wheel chair because of spinal degeneration. She also has other medical issues to deal with. When I first met Mary a year ago, she was experiencing some depression over increased loss of sight, because shots in her eyes were no longer working.

At the TUMI Information Night at Grace church, **Mary** came up to me and shared she was interested in participating in the TUMI program. She knew that would be a challenge, but I assured her "We'll find a way to make this happen." (I was prepared to read all the required reading to her if I had to.)

**Annissa** is a lovely, vibrant 52-year old. As a new Christian, she is on the recovery path after being an addict since her teens and has been sober for over a year. **Annissa** was divorced but is now happily remarried to her husband. She shines when she talks about her three adult sons and a granddaughter.

I first met **Annissa** as a guest at the Grace church Thanksgiving Dinner while seated at the table next to her table. She shared that Pastor CJ led the Celebrate Recovery program where she was involved. As we talked, I felt inspired to share about the TUMI program we were starting at Grace church, and she expressed an interest in learning about it. I also invited her to visit Grace church, which she did the next Sunday.

#### Incarceration to Incorporation (I2I)



TUMI's Incarceration to Incorporation (I2I) program was developed to help TUMI leaders empower prisoners upon their release—such as connecting them to friendly churches where they can attend and serve, organizations that provide housing and job training/placement, and TUMI class locations to complete the TUMI program.

The COVID-19 pandemic restrictions have hampered our holding a TUMI I2I information "Onisimus Workshop" for Denver area churches and prison ministries. Despite this COVID pandemic, two TUMI students from the men's prison where I work have been blessed by the I2I program in San Diego, CA. I thank Jesus for Rev. Rich Esselstrom who is the TUMI I2I contact.

- In May, a released prisoner/TUMI student arrived in San Diego and immediately contacted World Impact who put him in touch with Rich. Rich meets for coffee with the TUMI student (who lives only 5 blocks away). He reports that the student is back into taking TUMI classes and is involved in a great church where he attends Celebrate Recovery.
- Last year, I shared how Rich was able to help another released prisoner/TUMI student finish his last two TUMI modules and then graduate in July 2019. Rich stays in contact with this TUMI grad and reports he is doing well and is very involved with his home church. In May 2020, the TUMI grad was able to rent a nice apartment after Rich provided a personal reference letter for him.

#### TUMI Student Focus (continued)

In January, both **Mary and Annissa** started our new TUMI Capstone Program at Grace church. During the first TUMI class, **Annissa** shared her hesitancy to take TUMI, because school in her youth had been a difficult challenge for her. **Mary** shared her concerns with keeping up with the class requirements because of her blindness.

**Annissa**, upon hearing Mary's concern, offered to read the required readings (about 20 hours a week) to Mary, because it would ensure she would finish all the readings. They also became study partners—studying for quizzes, memory verses, finals, and more. Both women are excellent students.

Out of their TUMI study partnership, I have also watched these two women become close friends. Mary is Annissa's "Titus woman" (older woman mentoring the younger woman), and Annissa enjoys Mary's wisdom as a Christian woman and hearing about her faithful journey with the Lord.

**THANK YOU** for help feeding TUMI students in India!! On April 7, I got a text message from Mike Dicke, TUMI Denver Field Representative. He was asking for help with a message about Philemon, a long-time TUMI team member in India who works with Mike and Mary to take the TUMI program into local villages.

"Hi. I got a note from Philemon in India. Some TUMI students there have no food and no way to work with the [COVID-19] shut-down. If you know of anyone that would want to send them a little money, let me know. A few dollars buys a lot of rice."

I sent out an email to all the current TUMI students and grads, TUMI/Prison Fellowship mentors, and various TUMI partners asking—if they had the means—to help our friends in India.

We are so blessed to report that through your money gifts, we were able to feed TUMI students in two India locations:

- Philemon was able to feed 27 TUMI students for 21 days in India. We were also able to send a follow-up amount to assist in this effort.
- Sudipta was able to feed starving students in Kolkata.
