I love my job! I could not do this without the prayers and financial support of you my partners.

Greetings in the strong name of Jesus Christ! I praise the Lord that COVID-19 restrictions are lifting, and I pray that you all are well and getting back to a sense of some normalcy again.

Despite all the COVID-19 restrictions, I have stayed busy leading the TUMI class at Grace of the Lord Church in Aurora. Not working in the prisons allowed me to work closely with and encourage my Grace Church TUMI students—some who have not attended school for many years. The fruit is that all of my TUMI students are plugging

Also, praise the Lord that on May 27, we were allowed back into the men's prison to restart the TUMI program. It was a grand reunion for the TUMI students and the mentors. The women's prison has not yet set a date to start again. In my next newsletter, I will share stories with you from the incarcerated TUMI students about their journey with the Lord through the COVID-19 lockdowns.

I've introduced the Onesimus Workshop in past newsletters, but for various reasons was unable to hold one in Denver. Well, now I am excited to announce that we are planning an all-day Onesimus Workshop on Saturday, October 16, 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM, for Denver-area churches and ministries who are interested in identifying ministry to inmates and/or befriending and welcoming returning citizens into the church. In fact, the chaplain from the men's prison, several of my TUMI grads and students from the prisons, and TUMI ministry partners will be sharing. From November 2020 through early January 2021, several World Impact staff members invested their time and energy as a labor of love in preparing for World Impact's training programs to go online. Because this online platform—called World Impact U—was developed in-house, it was quite an accomplishment and a cost-saver. My assignments were to preview three online programs and provide my feedback to the World Impact U development team: 1) TUMI Module 14, 2) Onesimus Workshop, and 3) Trauma Healing Leadership. TUMI Student Focus

In March, I stayed home from church because of blizzard-like conditions. At Windsor Gardens where I live, no work had been done to remove snow from the sidewalks or streets, so I knew it was bad. Later in the morning, when I was spending time in the Word, my phone rang. Typically, I would not have answered, but on this day I did. It was a God thing.

The call went something like this: "Chaplain Kris? <Yes it is. Who is this?> This is Dana Brown. I'm so excited that I got ahold of you! I've tried to call before, but the number I had didn't work. I was just cleaning out some files and found an employer recommendation you had written for me, and it had this phone number on it."

I can't tell you how blessed I was to hear from Dana. Since graduating from TUMI in 2017 at the women's prison, she had been my assistant in leading Fight the Good Fight Bible studies, a precursor for taking TUMI.

When she was released, I gave Dana the Denver TUMI website address **denvertumi.org** so that she could get my contact information but had not heard from her. I was so sad to lose contact with her.

While in prison, Dana had participated in the Dog Training program, and now she was doing that same work on the outside—training, boarding, and walking dogs. She sounded so good.

Onesimus Workshop Coming to Denver

World Impact's Prison Ministry Program trains churches and ministries to do effective ministry in and through the local church. We do this in two ways:

- **Support on the inside.** We take church-based seminary (TUMI) inside the prisons.
- Support on the outside. Onesimus Workshops train churches and ministries to equip prisoners, welcome former prisoners into the life of the church, and empower them to do effective ministry.

The Onesimus Workshop is designed to help churches discuss the hard issues of reentry ministry; understand a Biblical view of prison ministry and prison culture; and encourage them to welcome and empower returned citizens. With training, men and women who have experienced incarceration can be powerful agents to advance God's Kingdom in and through the local church.

Rev. Rich Esselstrom, World Impact's Prison Ministry Director, will be facilitating the workshop with me. Rich has worked with World Impact in prison ministry—inside and outside—since 1986. He has been a great mentor to me and helped me find mentors for some of our released TUMI students.

We will also hear from the chaplain at the men's prison on how much TUMI has impacted the lives of those inmates he works with. And some of our released TUMI grads and students will be there to share what TUMI has meant to them inside and outside the prison.

TUMI International

Mike has been working diligently to get the TUMI curriculum and the Fight the Good Fight of Faith Bible Study workbook translated for the TUMI sites he started in Ethiopia and India.

In Ethiopia, he has been partnering with CRU (Campus Crusade) to translate the TUMI program materials into the Amharic language. The translations are in the works, and the Ethiopian mentors are excited to get started.

In India, the Telegu translations were halted two years ago due to lack of funds. Mike is pleased to share that the translations have started back up again using the same translation team they had two years ago.

Also in India, the initial stages of the Assamese language translations have started for the TUMI curriculum. The translation of Fight the Good Fight of Faith workbooks are completed; however a lack of funding halted the TUMI translations. The same TUMI mentor, who has a TUMI site in Assam, India, is working on the translations.
